Standing Orders

In order that the proceedings of the Congress be carried out expeditiously, the following Standing Oders will be observed:


- 1. The proposer of a Resolution or an Amendment thereto may speak for 5 minutes, but not more than 5 minutes
- 2. A delegate speaking to a Resolution or an Amendment must not exceed 3 minutes. A maximum of two delegates from any one county shall speak on any one motion.
- 3. The proposer of a Resolution or Amendment may speak a second time for 3 minutes before a vote is taken, but no other Delegate may speak a second time to the same Resolution or Amendment.
- 4. The Chairman may at any time he considers a matter has been sufficiently discussed call on the Proposer for a reply, and when that has been given a vote must be taken.
- 5. A delegate may, with the consent of the Chairman, move "that the question be now put", after which, when the Proposer has spoken, a vote must be taken.
- A speaker to Bainisteoir's report or to any other general discussion shall not exceed 3 minutes on any one topic.
- 7. Any motion seeking to amend a rule in Fo-Rialacha (CLLE) must have a majority equal to twothirds of those present entitled to vote and voting.
- 8. Standing Orders shall not be suspended for the purpose of considering any matter not on the agenda, except by the consent of a majority equal to two-thirds of those present entitled to vote and voting.
- 9. The Chairman may change the order of items on the agenda with the support of a simple majority of those present entitled to vote and voting.

For handballers throughout the country, 2009 was possibly one of the most successful on the court of play and saw considerable change in many ways within the Association.

The decision of Lorcán Ó Ruairc to retire after 20 years in his role as Riarthóir Náisiúnta, saw a change in personnell within the office. Lorcán has indeed been a tremendous help to myself over the past twelve months and continues to keep a very close eye on Irish Handball. Along with his wife, Philomena, he attended the World Championships as a special guest of the travelling Irish party and would certainly be appear to be enjoying his retriement.

I took over in my position as Bainisteoir Náisiúnta in February 2009 and, while finding the task a challenging and demanding one, I believe that our organisation is making great strides in the pursuit of catapulting Handball to become one of the high profile games in our country. There remains a huge task ahead in achieving that ambition but, such is the passion and commitment among our invaluable officials, players and supporters in the heart of very club in Ireland, that I have no doubt that we will indeed accomplish any goals set for the future.

Looking back at 2009 there were a number of outstanding highlights and, while there remain areas of concern and issues which need to be addressed, GAA Handball is certainly driving forward in a very positive direction.



The Official World Championship squad were presented to the handballing fraternity at the Softball finals night in Croke Park and then at half-time in front of 83,000 spectators at the All Ireland football final in Croke Park on Sunday.

Highlights in 2009:

- the rebranding of Handball as 'GAA Handball' which has provided a major boost in the profile of our game nationally and which will continue to prove so beneficial as we continue to work together as part of the biggest sporting organisation in this country.
- record breaking entries for the 2009 Envirogreen Irish Nationals and a terrific weekend tournament at Ulster venues, which proved such a resounding success.
- the 2008 National All Stars were presented at the Banquet in the Hillgrove Hotel in Monaghan and had just over 200 guests present at a tremendous evening for handball.



- our own 'Lá Liathróid Láimhe' which saw our handball clubs celebrate our outstanding game as part of the GAA125 celebrations in 2009.
- the relaunch of the national handball website, as www.gaahandball.ie, which is now receiving
 huge hits every day and growing in popularity by the month. Handball also moved onto Facebook
 and since it was launched in december now has over 750 fans on the site.
- the launch of the new GAA Handball Newsletter which will continue to provide a terrific source of information in a presentable manner for handballers and all people with an interest in our game from around the world. At the last count there are now 4,674 registered individuals receiving the newsletter.
- the record numbers which again took part in Féile na nGael in Offaly/Laois and the brilliant sight
 of all our young handballers in the Féile parade.
- the outstanding occasion of the All Ireland Juvenile 40x20 Championships in Kingscourt and the electric atmosphere of so many handballing people, young and old, coming together.
- the Ladbrokes One Wall Nationals in Breaffy House in Castebar, where over 360 players competed in a superb weekend of handball in a great location and as part of an outstanding social occasion
- the formation of 7 new handball clubs as part of a new National Development initiaitive which has continued to reap rewards moving into 2010
- the Softball Championship finals in Croke Park where we were treated to an epic doubles decider, won by Dublin, and which saw successful new initiatives including - presentations to the Jubilee Senior Champions (1984), the on-court shoot out and the launch of the 'President's Award' presented to Cork's Peter Denehy for 'services to handball'.
- Presentation of the official 'World Handball Championship Squad' to the crowd at half-time in the All Ireland Senior Football Final in front of 83,000 spectators at Croke Park in September.
- The largest ever official playing squad travelling to the World Handball Championships in Portland
 a total of 18 official players were on the travelling party.
- The outststanding successes achieved in the World Championships in Portland. A record breaking total of 35 world championship titles and an amazing list of 37 World Handball champions, from 19 different counties in Ireland, taking gold back to this country in October.
- The unprecedented three-in-a-row World title wins of Paul Brady and Fiona Shannon
- The World Open doubles win of Fiona Shannon & Sibeal Gallagher and in particular the Mens doubles triumph achieved by Eoin Kennedy and Michael Finnegan, following Paul Brady's forced withdrawal from the doubles event due to injury

- Our 37 World Handball Champions being invited to attend Arás an Uachtaraín and meeting President Mary McAleese who congratulated handball on the outstanding successes.
- All 37 World Champions invited to a special Banquet hosted by the GAA in Croke Park where they
 were honoured for their oustanding achievements in 2009.
- The many awards picked up by our magnificent champions throughout the country
- the launch of the first ever stand-alone 'GAA Handball National All-Star Awards Banquet' in Croke Park on December 5th. Almost 400 guests attended the black-tie dinner and celebrated an incredible year for the sport. A total of 52 Provincial Award winners were initially presented before the National awards were handed out on a very special night for handball.
- Another highly successful trip to the USHA Junior Nationals in Chicago, winning 5 of the 6 junior singles titles our official team competed in, while a further 4 titles were also won by Irish players.
- the first ever 'GAA Showdown' handball event, hosted in Croke Park, and which featured many of the top stars in gaelic football, hurling, camogie, ladies football and rounders coming together with our top handballers on the court of play.
- an increase in sponsorship revenue for the association with that figure set to increase again in 2010 as part of an ongoing marketing and sponsorship plan. This is very encouraging considering the very serious economic problems.
- ongoing Coaching and Development programme which has seen a major increase in interest
 particularly within schools around the country. This included a pilot coaching programme in
 Limerick which is proving very successful, a One Wall Schools Development initiative in Ulster, a
 Handball Roadshow in Connacht and an overall increase in coaching tutors. There will be further
 exciting initiatives in this in the future.
- hugely impressive work being done in the promotion and development of Juvenile and ladies handball at many clubs around the country.
- the launch of the Ladies handball classic event in St Coman's in August 2009
- the ongoing success of the Handball residential summer camp and the major inclusion of handball in the Cúl Camps in 19 counties. Continued work on this can be of major benefit for our sport.
- Huge turnouts and successful tournaments at third level coleges level which has also seen
 eyecatching international successes by our Collegiate players.

Disappointing areas which have been highlighted as needing further attention are:

- the poor state of the Handball Centre at Croke Park, which was really highlighted at the GAA Showdown on 6th December, where many guests, players and spectators voiced their concerns at the use of the centre for future National games.
- following a relatively disappointing turnout at the National Open Forum in Croke park, work has been ongoing to formulate a draft plan for moving forward with the 'Strategic Vision of the Future' for Handball and this will continue in the months ahead
- there is a very clear need, as part of the ongoing work on the national development plan, to provide a source of funding avenues for clubs looking to upgrade facilities. However this will be a very difficult task facing handball in the years ahead in tough recessional times.
- there is a need for proper governance in many clubs, and indeed county boards, around the country.
- the poor promotion of 60x30 softball and hardball in many parts of the country
- TV and national press coverage remains a priority for the Council. Progress has been made but much great work lies ahead in this. Unfortunately, in today's highly competitive media market, and the ability of networks to monitor viewing figures, work needs to be done to dramatically increase spectators at our key national games. Until our spectator viewing rises at major games it will be difficult to entice the key TV partners
- players failing to turn up for games without prior notice through the correct channels and in particular notifying their opposition



National Competitions

Ard Comhairle were responsible for running a total of 233 competitions, having also taken over responsibility for the One Wall Nationals in 2009, while there were also 19 other events arranged in provincial tournaments elsewhere.

In the 40x20 Championships, Paul Brady (An Cabhán) retained his All Ireland Senior Singles title, defeating Eoin Kennedy (Áth Cliath) in the final in St. Coman's. There was a significant breakthrough for Connacht in the Senior doubles as Dessie Keegan and Joe McCann (Muigheo) claimed the honours there. Eoin Kennedy (Áth Cliath) continued his dominance in the softball code with victory in the Senior Singles and teamed up with Egin Jensen to win the doubles title too. Eoin Kennedy also claimed the Senior Hardball singles crown in a remarkable year on the Irish courts.

In the ladies codes, there was a singles and doubles title success again in the 40x20 court for Fiona Shannon (Aontroim), playing alongside her sister Sibeal in the doubles triumph. Bernie Henessy (Luimneach) made a remarkable comeback to win the Ladies Senior softball singles title.

A new proposal in the structure of the Open Senior Singles Championships was passed for trial in 2010 and 2011 for the 40x20 and 2010 for the 60x30.




2009 was another record breaking year for Dublin's Eoin Kennedy

60x30 Softball Championships, sponsored by Martin Donnelly

There was a very exciting climax to the 60x30 championships with a classic Open Senior doubles decider in Croke Park, in which Dublin denied Meath in a two game thriller in front of a capacity crowd.

However, there would remain concerns in many grades at provincial level where there were relatively few entries and in some events, no entries at all. With no minor representatives at minor level from Ulster, the 60x30 code would need to be looked at in particular in the northern province while there wasn't a single game played in the Under 21 doubles in the Connacht v Ulster half of the draw. Overall, work needs to be done on the development of the 60x30 game although it should be stressed that the competitions were also affected by the World championships in 2009.

Overall in the 60x30 court at adult level there were 34 Mens titles up for grabs and the honours were shared between 12 counties. Kilkenny top the list with 8 60x30 Softball championship titles to their credit with Mayo and Dublin next best on 5 titles apiece. Limerick and Wexford finished the adult 60x30 series with 3 All Ireland titles each while there were 2 triumphs for Galway, Tipperary and Roscommon. Cork, Cavan, Carlow and Sligo finished the competitions with 1 All Ireland win. The spread provincially reads 10 wins for Connacht (4 counties), 6 wins for Munster (3 counties), 17 title wins for Leinster (4 counties) and 1 win for Ulster (1 county).

At minor level, Stephen Cooney emerged as a real force in the traditional court with a singles and doubles success, alongside Ian McLoughlin, and in winning the minor crown brought the title to Mayo for the first time since Dessie Keegan claimed the honours back in 1998.

Limerick's Seamus O'Carroll continues to make waves in all codes and his emphatic Under 21 singles and doubles triumph, with his partner CJ Fitzpatrick, were just two successes in a remarkable season which saw 7 All Ireland and 2 World titles secured by the Cappagh teenager.

Dublin's Eoin Kennedy capped a remarkable year on the court of play with his sixth consecutive Senior Singles title win in the Softball championship, and 7th in all. He went on to reclaim the doubles crown with his partner, Egin Jensen, defeating the reigning champions, Meath's Tom Sheridan and Brian Carroll in the final.

In the Ladies 60x30 championships, 7 counties shared 10 All Ireland titles between them. Mayo top the list there with 4 All Ireland title wins and the other 6 counties with one championship win apiece are Wicklow, Clare, Kilkenny, Roscommon, Limerick and Kerry.



Limerick's Bernie Hennessy made an amazing return to the top of the tree in Senior singles winning that title at the expense of Kerry's Ashley Prenderville, who was chasing a three-in-a-row in the blue ribband event. Ashley Prenderville did not finish the season empty handed however as she teamed up with her sister, Meabh, to win the Ladies Open Senior doubles crown with a final win over Roscommon's Deirdre Donohoe and Katie Costeloe.

Wicklow's Shauna Hilley was another young star who had an amazing season on the court and her dramatic Minor 60x30 singles win over Mayo's Amy Corrigan was one of the highlights. Amy Corrigan did team up with Leona Ryder to win the minor doubles title, which was one of 4 wins for the county in the ladies 60x30 championships.

ALL-IRELAND CHAMPIONSHIP

The Juvenile 60x30 championships saw 6 counties share the 8 boys titles on offer and a similar scenario in the girls events with 5 counties winning the 8 titles. Wexford emerged the dominant county in the Boys Juvenile 60x30 championships with 3 titles, the highlight being Dean Corrigan's eyecatching Under 16 championship success against Galway's Martin Mulkerrins. The remainder were shared between Limerick, Roscommon, Galway, Clare and Waterford. In the girls championships, Kilkenny ended the year with 3 victories with Roscommon, Galway, Clare, Kerry and Limerick claiming one title win each.

60x30 Hardball Championships

Dublin's Eoin Kennedy had a fantastic season as he added the GAA Handball All Ireland Senior Singles crown to his impressive list of honours. His 21-16, 21-17 win over Mayo's Dessie Keegan saw him take the honours while Meath's Tom Sheridan and Brian Carroll added another major doubles triumph with their final win over Mayo's Dessie Keegan and Joe McCann 18-21, 21-8, 21-4.

Mayo's Stephen Cooney had a remarkable year winning four of the six minor titles on offer in 2009, winning the Minor hardball singles crown but Kilkenny's Eoghan Hennessy and Keith Bourke captured the doubles honours in the grade.


Overall the oldest code of our games needs urgent attention and

while there is encouragement amongst our player representation, particularly coming through at minor level, Hardball does need a major injection of popularity around the clubs. GAA Handball 40x20 Championships, sponsored by Dalkia

Kilkenny also topped the roll of honour in the 40x20 championships with 8 titles in mens adult grades and 10 championship wins overall in adult and juvenile grades. Significantly, as in the 60x30 court, Mayo claimed second spot in the table with 5 adult wins and 6 championship titles in total with Cork next best on 5 titles.

GOO HANDBALL

A total of 22 counties shared the 60 40x20 championship titles on offer in adult and juvenile grades, ladies and mens codes. Leinster were the dominant province with 22 All Ireland championship successes in the 40x20 with 15 titles going to Connacht, Munster winning 14 championship titles and Ulster claiming the remaining 9.



Cavan's Paul Brady once again maintained his incredible level of form in the international court in 2009 as he powered his way to a 5th successive Open Senior singles title (6th in total) with a 21-10, 21-4 win over Eoin Kennedy (Dublin) in Roscommon.

There was a major breakthrough for Mayo's Dessie Keegan and Joe McCann during the season as the duo produced a remarkable display to win an epic senior doubles decider on 21-19, 29-21, 21-19 scoreline against 5 time winners, Paul Brady and Michael Finnegan (Cavan) in Kilkenny.

At minor level, Tyrone's Caolan Daly brought the singles championship title to Tyrone for the first time in 16 years when he denied Meath's Gary McConnell in the final with Mayo's Stephen Cooney and Ian McLoughlin denying Kilkenny in the minor doubles final.

In the ladies arena the dominance of Antrim's Fiona Shannon continued as she recorded an unprecedented 9th singles success, at the expense of club colleague, Aisling Reilly. Shannon again teamed up with her sister Sibeal to win the Open senior doubles crown. Ulster enjoyed considerable success in the 40x20 court too as Down's Lorraine Havern captured the minor singles crown and Cork's Catriona Casey and Aisling O'Keefe secured minor doubles honours.

Record breaker, Michael Ducksy Walsh (Kilkenny) continues to have an air of invincibility in the Masters grades and he stormed to the singles title in the 40x20 court.

Clare topped the charts in the Juvenile 40x20 championships, winning 3 boys and 1 girls title, and a significant clean sweep in the Under 14 boys grades through Barry Nash (Under 14 singles) and Colin Crehan and Patrick Fitzgerald (Under 14 doubles).

Munster dominated the juvenile boys 40x20 championships with 5 of the 8 titles on offer and Leinster, Connacht and Ulster claiming one boys juvenile title each. Significantly, no county won 2 titles in the juvenile girls 40x20 championships with 3 wins going to Connacht, 2 each to Leinster and Munster and 1 to Ulster.

The 2009 Irish 40x20 Nationals had added significance in 2009 with many of the events deciding the placings on the Official irish Handball team travelling to the World Handball Championships in Portland, Oregon.

Once again Paul Brady and Fiona Shannon secured the premier Open titles, again denying Eoin Kennedy and Aisling Reilly respectively in the finals.

The decision of Ard Comhairle to add extra players places on the Official irish squad in 2009, saw added significance for the Masters and Golden Masters grades at the Nationals. Michael Ducksy Walsh had a tremendous tussle with old rival Tom Sheridan, before securing his place on the team and Mayo's Kevin Geraghty reversed champinship form with Kilkenny's Johnny Brennan, to claim the Golden Masters place.

Overall it was a hugely successful Irish Nationals yournament in 2009 wth a record 352 entries in the 18 events. During the year, Ard Comhairle also passed proposals to separate the Adult and Junior Nationals in 2010 with new grades now added to both events, with 16 grades in the Adult nationals to be staged in Ulster on May holiday weekend.



There was a great deal which could have been derived from the World championships in Portland and which will need to be looked at in more depth in preparation for the 2012 Worlds in Ireland. There is no doubt that the 2012 event could provide an overwhelming opportunity for Irish Handball to reach the pinnacle in terms of promotion in this country. Plans for the event are already underway with a proposal to set up an organising committee in the very near future to be looked at by Central Council in the weeks ahead.

In relation to where the 2012 World championships will be staged, a lot will be determined by how things unfold in relation to proposals to build a new National Handball Centre. The GAA have backed the Council's request for a new centre and have committed €9million towards building a National Centre in Croke Park. A great deal of work remains to be done in respect of this in the months ahead and it will be imperative that all our members and officials unite to ensure that this goes ahead. There will be much more discussion on this in the weeks ahead and further details will follow from CLLE and the GAA.

Ireland claim five of six USHA Junior titles in December

CLLE decided to send an official team to the 2009 USHA Junior National championships in Chicago in December and appointed a management team of Ryan Daly (Tír Eoghain) and Frances Ní Churraoin (Gaillimh). Over 100 players competed in Irish junior trials and Corcaigh enjoyed tremendous success, winning four of the 6 places on offer. The official team which travelled was: Boys 19 & Under - Shane Hedigan (Corcaigh), Boys 17 & Under - Killian Carroll (Corcaigh), Boys 15 & Under - Denis O'Neill (Corcaigh), Girls 19 & Under - Shauna Hilley (CIII Mhaintain), Girls 17 & Under - Catriona Casey (Corcaigh), Girls 15 & Under - Ciana Ní Churraoin (Gaillimh).

Ireland secured the Boys 17 & Under and Boys 15 & Under singles titles while the girls enjoyed a clean sweep in their grades. At 17 & Under level Killian Carroll also teamed up with Tír Eoghain's Conor McElduff to win the doubles title while Tir Eoghain's Johnny Woods and Ryan Mullan also won the Boys 13 & Under doubles title.


Ireland will look again at the USHA Nationals in 2010 although further work will be done in gauging the viability of the trip with ongoing issues in the USA between the USHA and WPH, CLLE will host our Irish Junior Nationals in November 2010 and the winners of the key 6 grades will again be Ireland's representatives on the International trip. A decision will follow in relation to the trip from Central Council later in the year.

GAA Handball Club Championships







With a team also travelling over from England, this event proved a huge success and one in which the future looks very bright indeed. The competition was initially set up by the Sligo Handball Board 14 years earlier and they deserve the utmost credit for organising this each year and attracting great numbers from around the country. Many were again involved as part of the 2009 organising committee and played key roles in ensuring the terrific success of the 2009 One Wall Nationals.

There was added significance also in 2009 with the winners of the Mens Open Singles and Ladies Open Singles joining the Official Irish squad for the World Handball Champinships. Armagh's Charly Shanks and Roscommon's Marianna Rushe emerged convincing winners of both those competitions and as such captained the Irish Federation Cup team in the World One Wall Championships.

As can be seen from the table a total of 18 Cup titles and 13 Plate wins were spread amongst 10 Counties and the English handball team. Galway topped the One Wall Nationals winners charts with 7 titles, of which 6 were very significantly in the Cup events, thus seeing them collect one third of the Cup titles on offer. Mayo were next best on the list with 4 wins and Armagh, who have been doing a great deal of work on the one wall code in recent times, being rewarded with 3 wins.

We should also congratulate the English players, Andy Pringle and Peter Cohen, who secured wins for the travelling party at the event.

The 2010 One-Wall Nationals is again scheduled for Breaffy House on the first weekend in July and preparations are already underway for what could prove to be a record breaking weekend tournament.

Venue Officials and Refereeing

I believe it to be hugely important to acknowledge and offer sincere special thanks to the plethora of tremendous voluntary officials who devote so much time to their own club and counties and yet who are always willing to make themselves available for our national games. The amount of time and commitment which I have witnessed by venue officials and referees in 2009 epitomises the great ethos of the voluntary community spirit of the GAA which we are very much a part off.

I do find it concerning however that many players take this voluntary effort for granted much too often and openly criticise the venues, officials and referees who do so much to ensure that our national games can take place.

It should also be mentioned that Con Moore has now developed and rolled out the Referee's coaching



course in all 4 provinces, with over 60 individuals having now completed the course. The next phase of this plan will be to see provinces draw up their 'Referee's Lists' with designated county, provincial and national referees for going into the future. Much of this will be targeted as part of the new Strategic Vision for handball and more details will follow in due course.

Strategic Plan for GAA Handball and Open Forum

Comhairle Liathróid Láimhe na hÉireann organised a National Open Forum in May 2009, to discuss all aspects of the current Strategic Plan and look at ideas and ways of restructuring this plan and build our sport for the future. O'Kelly and Sutton Consultants, who have been responsible for the GAA's National Strategic Plan, have consulted with the council on this and Peter Hanan in particular has put in a great deal of time as part of the Strategic Review Committee on this.

A total of 68 people travelled to Croke park for the Open Forum and, while the attendance in some ways was disappointing, there was no doubting the enthusiasm and knowledge which was present to discuss all aspects of handball. The Strategic Review Committee are preparing now to present the new structure for the 'Strategic Vision for GAA Handball' into the future and will then be organising a follow up day in Croke Park which will include specific work-shops in each category of the Strategy. Specific committees will be announced and all handballing members will be given the opportunity to provide input into each section and also to put forward their interest in playing a role in one of the National Strategic Committees. Ultimately, the new plan will be very much club, county, provincial, national and internationally focussed with key targets to be set in every one of those areas, ensuring that every handball member will play their part in the overall strategy of 'Raising the Game'.

Further details on structure, schedules and planning on this will follow Congress 2010.

National Development Plan and Officer

Niamh Egan, who previously was employed in the role as Promotions Officer for Comhairle Liathróid Láimhe na hÉireann, will now be focussing more on the area of development. Niamh's new post in the Council will be as National Development and Media Officer, where she will be the national co-ordinator of the new development plan set to be launched in April 2010. Niamh will also be the servicing officer to the Coaching committee.

This will be worked on with a proposed National Coaching and Development Committee, whereby the Council will outline plans to work closely with Clubs, County Boards and Provincial Council's to look closely at areas of development for our game within schools, GAA clubs, dormant clubs and all areas of the commmunity. A document proposing plans for this National Development Strategy will follow in conjunction with the launch of the National Strategic Vision for GAA Handball.

Coaching and development

The national coaching task team continues to undertake a structured and progressive coaching plan at all levels of the association. The foundation and level 1 coaching courses have been ongoing and, in line with the new national coaching and development strategy being proposed, this will see further progression in the year ahead. Con Moore and Tony Healy, who is handball's representative on the National GAA Coaching Games committee, are almost complete in their production of a new GAA Handball Coaching DVD, which will prove invaluable to our many coaches throughout the country. It is envisaged this will be launched by April 2010. In line with this development will be the launch of a complete new coaching resource pack which will include posters, coaching cards, and many coaching resources which will be of great benefit to our hundreds of coaches everywhere. Again there has been

a great deal of work gone into this initialtive over the past 6-8 months and will be ready to launch by mid-year 2010.

Already the One-Wall Schools coaching and development plan has been launched in Ulster in conjunction with the Ulster GAA Council, where 22 post-primary schools have attended training days and all 64 of the Ulster GAA Council development officers will be trained up in the foundation coaching certificate. To date 8 of the schools have put in the one-wall courts identical to those set up in Breaffy House and this has seen major interest generated in these schools. Plans will continue to further develop this initiative around the country in conjunction with the provincial councils and county boards.






Promotion and Sponsorship planning

As part of the council's strategy for 'Raising the Game', an in-depth look at promotions, marketing and sponsorship has been undertaken. The rebranding of our sport as GAA Handball was the initial phase of this plan and since then considerable work has taken place to build a newer more dynamic and professional image in all our presentation.

A redrafting of all our literature is currently being undertaken and much of this will be presented in time for Congress 2010 with more to follow afterwards. All future posters, programmes, coaching informational literature, entry forms, information booklets, publications will follow this theme as we plan to make our games an attractive and enticing hunting ground for sponsors in 2010 and beyond.

These are extremely difficult times financially in all parts of the country and they will certainly be challenging times for handball and work will continue to ensure that GAA Handball are very





much in the minds of prospective sponsors as we plan forward. An increase in sponsorship revenue was achieved in 2009 but a more ambitious approach is underway in 2010 and full details of this will be finalised for presentation mid-year to Ard Comhairle. It should be noted that this will be a staged process as part of the build-up to the World Championships in 2012 and it will take time to reach the stage that handball will be to the forefront of securing major sponsorship revenue at the level more top-tier sports are acquiring.

Key areas which are a problem for GAA Handball at present and which have been featured and mentioned numerous times are - media exposure, TV and press coverage and sponsorship. Significantly




all are connected and each has a knock-on effect on the other. The problem in enticing TV and national press coverage for our games is that, especially in today's immensely competitive market, coverage is based upon viewing figures, commercial attractiveness and popularity. For GAA Handball to secure it's place in this sphere it must be seen to be commercially viable and in itself be attracting large attendances at our games. Until we attract large crowds and packed stands at national finals, etc... we are always going to be a less viable proposition for the top tier sponsors and TV and national press.

However, through the GAA Handball brandmark we have an opportunity to tap into resources not previously available. 2010 will see an upturn in targets and objectives but it will still take the possibility of confidently raising our own viewing figures to attract the major media networks and of course this will have a domino effect on the popularity of our games.

As can be seen from the Council's financial statements for the year 2009, a great deal was spent on the area of promotions. We will continue to work with the finance department of the GAA Central Council in relation to a promotional grant going back to 2009 although this has already now been secured for 2010. In a link with TV and Webstreaming company, CN SPorts, GAA Handball will be coming more and more into the public eye.

CN Sports televised our GAA Showdown and All Star Awards and plans are underway to have this shown as part of an opening documentary style handball show, in a series of GAA Handball shows in 2010. With delays in CN Sports licensing agreements, we will now be launching our TV broadcasting with the 40x20 Open Senior Final on 10th April 2010 and following up with the doubles decider on 24th April. The Irish Nationals finals will be featured on the bank holiday may weekend as will the One-Wall Nationals, 60x30 two final nights, Irish Junior Nationals in November and our GAA Showdown and All Star Awards at the end of the year.



Niamh Egan will continue her role in ensuring GAA Handball are securing space in the national press but, as part of the promotional development and press coverage at provincial level, GAA Handball will be providing a €500 expenses grant for provincial PROs. A training day for the designated PROs in each province will take place in April 2010 as part of this promotional plan.

An A1 size GAA Handball promotional Wallplanner will be launched at Congress 2010 and, as part of our restructuring of promotional literature, will see the One Year Calendar comprising 1st May to 30th April the following year each time. Following Congress each year, the council will also issue an annual GAA Handball Official Guide which will include updated bye-laws, rules, committees, contact information in clubs and counties, clár 1st May to 30th April, and all useful information and links. This will follow Congress 2010 and will be distributed to all officials by end of April 2010.


The plan to launch the new GAA Handball pictorial Calendar for 2010 was put back due to costings in 2009 but this will form part of the new approved plan from Central Council this year. At present all paid registered members will receive the 'Top Ace' Magazine as part of their membership. It was agreed that this would remain in place until the new issue, due to be launched at Congress 2010, is distributed. Following this a new-look Top Ace Magazine will become a more regular publication that will form part of a subscription package with all funds going towards the 'development plan' for helping clubs throughout the country. Details of this will follow Congress 2010 but I believe they will be welcomed by all our members. In turn, all registered members from the end of this year will receive their Annual full colour pictorial GAA Handball calendar by December 2010.

GAA Handball saw the launch of our new national handball website in 2009 and so far has seen considerable development in this sphere with a lot more to come. This official site will be the official focal point for all our members with up to date news stories, official fixtures and results, photo galleries and video footage. It has taken 8 months to get to the current stage of planning on the website but 2010

will see major strides again on the site. This will become a more interactive utility for all players and officials. There will be a great deal of work carried out by August 2010 in relation to the video and audio section of the website and a new merchandise and online shop will be launched by 1st May 2010.

The major plan as part of this constant progression in the online world will see the recently added provincial sections expanded. The new PROs will be responsible for updating the provincial sections, which will move to the top of the website homepage and these will include up to date news, fixtures and results



within each province. As part of this process also, our officials from county and provincial level will be set up into the new gaa googlemail system for handball with the intranet system to follow by the year end - which will be of huge benefit for committees and officials at all levels.

The Coaching and Development section on the website will be expanded to highlight the major drive which will be ongoing from 2010 while the Download section will be providing all resources, entry forms, etc... in PDF format for anyone to utilise. The Find-a-club link, which was developed by David Smith, will also be developed further as GAA Handball work on making our entire network of clubs and contacts available to the public.

GAA Handball Merchandise and Online Shop

As part of the Council's ongoing business development plan for increasing revenue to go towards the overall national development plan, a range of GAA Handball merchandise will be launched in 2010. This will also further enhance the profile of GAA Handball in Ireland.



The council will be offering GAA Handball products as follows - gloves, handballs, eyeguards, kits and a series of promotional GAA Handball jerseys (including the World 2012 jersey) in association with one of our main sponsors, O'Neills International. In addition, by mid-year, there will also be DVDs produced from our key events to include initially the GAA showdown, the All-Star Awards 2009 and championship finals. This range of DVDs will continue to be expanded over time.

A merchandise agreement has also been made with our official ball supplier, Macsports, that all our handballs will have the GAA Handball mark and purchase of all handballs will now be made from 1st April direct from Croke Park. There will be special reduced rates for clubs ordering any of



our merchandise in small bulk while purchasing can be done online through the online shop, to be launched on 1st May 2010 at the Irish Nationals weekend, or by order form with payment - order forms will be distributed to all clubs in April 2010.


GAA Handball Newsletter and digital add-ons

The promotional work carried out in 2009 included the launch of the GAA Handball Newsletter and this will now really come to the fore in 2010 with at least 1 edition issued per month detailing all the up-todate news, announcements, reviews, previews and features. Ultimately it will be seen as a further major resource for publicising our games to the national and international arena. Through the registration process we have already built up a database of over 4,500 members who have requested to receive the newsletter, which will again be a terrific means of enticing sponsors to our brand image. As the digital online newsletter gathers pace over the year the plan will be to focus on the onine digital magazine template with video, flash and audio footage included.

All Star Awards and Promotional events

As shown in the financial statements for 2009, CLLE actually hosted two All Star Awards banquets in 2009. Firstly the 2008 awards were passed out at the awards ceremony in the Hillgrove Hotel, Monaghan, on Irish Nationals weekend back in April 2009. Then, as part of a new phase of development approved by Central Council, the new-look stand alone All Star Awards Banquet took place in Croke Park on Friday 4th December. There were 392 guests present at the black-tie event which proved to be a huge success.

The evening was hosted by RTE's Marty Morrissey and began with the introduction of the 37 World champions. Following this was the presentation of awards to the 4 provincial All Star Award winners and with those winners then forming the nominations list for the National awards categories. Special guest on the evening was Tyrone allstar, Peter Canavan, and he spoke highly of the sport and how he has since taken up the sport himself with great enthusiasm in his school, Holy Trinity College, Cookstown.

RULES

Part II Court and Equipment

D. PLAYING ATTIRE.

In all inter-county championship, league and other official matches, each player is required continuously to wear a T-shirt and Togs bearing the colours of the county as registered with the GAA, Sport Shoes and Socks. In doubles matches partners must be similarly attired, i.e. T-Shirts, Shorts and Socks should match. Failure to comply with this rule will involve a fine which must be paid before the county may continue to compete in official competitions or championships.

E BLOOD RULE.

A player who is bleeding or has blood on any part of his/her body, playing attire or playing equipment as a result of an injury sustained during play, shall, on the instruction of the referee, immediately leave the court to receive medical and/or other attention. He/she shall not be allowed to return to the court until the bleeding has stopped, all blood has been cleaned off, and where possible, the injured area has been covered, any bloodstained playing attire has been replaced and any bloodstained playing equipment has been fully cleaned. A player is allowed a maximum of 15 minutes injury time and this includes blood injury.

Part III Officials and Officiating

B 3. Appeal Calls.

During the rally, if a player feels his opponent did not return the ball legally (Short Ball, Double Bounce, Wrist Ball, or Carry), he may appeal at end of rally. He then accepts the consequences of the appeal.

A marker shall be appointed to keep a record of the points scored and assist the referee by keeping the record of the order of service. The referee shall inform the players of the score before each service. A Referee may appoint linespersons to assist in appeal calls.


